

Jonas Viles Award

Purpose of Award:

The Friends of the Missouri State Archives annually present the Jonas Viles Award to a person or organization that has made a significant contribution to the preservation of Missouri's heritage. Named after the University of Missouri professor who rescued thousands of documents from the capitol lawn after the 1911 fire, this award is given to those possessing a deep commitment to the preservation and study of Missouri's history, as well as having made a positive impact on the safekeeping, accessibility, scholarship and/or promotion of the state's past.

Accomplishments of previous Jonas Viles Award winners include:

- discovering historical records;
- processing extensive collections of records with limited financial resources;
- securing workspace for local records projects; placing scans of original documents online;
- providing significant financial support for historical projects;
- securing federal grant funding for historical projects;
- sponsoring a statewide conference with a variety of complementary activities; and
- creating publications, radio programs and other works.

Nomination and Selection Procedures:

Friends of the Missouri State Archives members, staff of the Missouri State Archives and the public are all encouraged to submit nominations. *Nomination form(s) must be postmarked no later than Friday, May 5, 2023.* The Friends of the Missouri State Archives' Awards Committee will select the winner and a plaque will be presented to the individual/institution at the annual meeting in June 2023.

Eligibility:

Nominees must have made a contribution to Missouri's archival and historical community within the past five years, and that contribution must have exceeded routine and expected duties. Members of the Friends of the Missouri State Archives Board of Directors and Missouri State Archives staff are *not eligible* for nomination. Residents and organizations located in states outside of Missouri *are eligible*, but only if their work has made a significant impact within Missouri. Special consideration will be given to nominees whose work relates to the collections and programs of the Missouri State Archives.
